Arts/Museums/Homes/Cemetery

At the Telfair Museum of Art, there is something for everyone, from the novice to the experienced art connoisseur. To make your museum experience as pleasant, informative, and convenient as possible, we offer competitive admission rates, daily docent-guided tours at no extra charge, and a host of art-related events and activities for all ages.
- ✓ **Roundhouse Railroad Museum** 912-651-6823
A favorite for kids of all ages, this museum features a large collection of historic locomotives and rolling stock. This massive facility, constructed in 1835, served as a train construction and repair facility for the Central of Georgia Railway. It is part of the most complete antebellum railroad complex in the US. Today, you can ride on a train and take a spin on the large turntable.

A pioneer in the restoration movement, Alida Harper grew to become one of the most successful Savannah women in the 20th century. Her life and achievements are remembered still today as visitors explore the home that is maintained just as Alida wanted.
- ✓ **Davenport House Museum** 912-236-8097 www.davenportmuseum.org
The mission of the Isaiah Davenport House Museum is to preserve and interpret the American Federal-style house, and the artifacts within, built by master builder Isaiah Davenport for his household with an emphasis on the years 1820-27, in order to educate, enrich and inspire our visitors and the community, as well as recognize the historical role of the house in the founding of Historic Savannah Foundation.

✓ **Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace 912-233-4501** www.juliettegordonlowbirthplace.org

A Girl Scout national center in Savannah, Georgia—has something to offer everyone. It is the birthplace of Juliette Gordon Low, founder of Girl Scouts of the USA, who was affectionately known by her family and friends as "Daisy." Built in 1821, the house has been elegantly restored to reflect the 1880s and furnished with many original Gordon family pieces, including artwork by Juliette Gordon Low. Located in the heart of the Savannah Historic District, "the Birthplace," as it is commonly called by Girl Scouts nationwide, was the city's first National Historic Landmark.

✓ **Mercer Williams House Museum 912-236-6352** www.mercerhouse.com

Located on Monterey Square behind the The DeSoto, Jim Williams lived here in 1861 and had his antique store behind the carriage house. Mercer House is the center stage for much of *Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil*. Jim Williams held his well-known Christmas parties in the house, and its study was the site of the shooting death of Danny Hansford (the character is named Billy Hanson in the film).

✓ **Owens-Thomas House 912-233-9743**

Located on Oglethorpe Square, this English Regency style home was originally built in 1819 but was later willed to the Telfair Museum of Art in 1951. The Marquis de Lafayette, a wealthy French citizen and soldier who greatly assisted the Americans during the Revolutionary War, visited Savannah in 1825 to dedicate the Nathanael Greene Monument. He stayed at this house during his visit and addressed the people of Savannah from the southern balcony facing President Street.

✓ **Green-Meldrim House 912-233-3845**

Located on Madison Square behind the The DeSoto, this Gothic Revival 1853 home was originally built for Charles Green, an Englishman who was a wealthy cotton merchant. When Savannah was surrendered to the Union Army in December 1864, Green offered his home to General Sherman to serve as his headquarters while in Savannah. It was from here that Sherman sent his famous telegram to President Lincoln presenting the city as a Christmas gift.

✓ **Colonial Park Cemetery**

Established in 1750 and closed to burials in 1853. Even though there are only about 600 burial markers present, it is estimated that there could be as many as 9,000 people buried there. During the Union occupation of Savannah in the Civil War, Union troops camped and stabled horses here. Many graves were desecrated during this time as some of the troops looted graves and vaults seeking valuables. They also changed the dates on some of the tombstones in a poor attempt at humor. Many of the damaged tombstones have been cemented to the cemetery's eastern wall.

✓ **Forsyth Park & the Fountain**

Located less than 4 minutes behind the The DeSoto, the park was originally established in the 1840's and has served as a location for large public events and celebrations. The cast iron fountain erected in 1858 is probably the most photographed site in Savannah.
